In my talk I present the findings of an empirical study about city wikis in Germany. City wikis are social platforms created by citizens to inform and communicate about local affairs within a certain geographical boundary. They use wiki software and the Internet as a technical platform. The wikis are the result of decentralized collaborative communicative actions of the citizens. City wikis establish and preserve non-spectacular information creating a digital city encyclopedia with points of interest from the citizen's perspective. Gate-keeping or agenda-setting by professional journalists or politicians do not play a role. City wikis are social communication platforms which empower the citizens in their every-day talks in their public sphere. They establish a new possibility to communicate beyond the institutionalized discourses of the government and the political communication mediated by the mass media.
